

Why Work by Skype?

Modern information and communication technology overcomes the barriers of distance. It delivers high value for low cost, reduces environmental impact, and stimulates creativity.

"Skyping" is easy and natural. Meetings and discussions can be conducted through standard PCs or mobile phones, from any office location. Screens can be shared in both directions to view, discuss and edit presentations and documents in real time. Further contacts can be flexibly added to the connection, to link people in multiple locations or to establish simultaneous or consecutive translation facilities. E-mail and Internet can continue to operate while Skyping.

Are There Any Technological Issues?

Skype is a low-cost, easy-to-use communication facility that links people across the Internet through any personal computer or mobile device, on any operating system. Connections are immediately established by creation of a Skype user and exchange of contact information.

Skype uses standard cameras and microphones fitted to all modern devices. Only moderate Internet reliability, speed and bandwidth are needed. On-line support is always available.

Skype for Business is now "Microsoft Teams", an integral part of Office 365. It can be fully linked with other components and programs. (see <https://www.skype.com/en/business/>)

How Secure Is Skype?

Skype automatically applies confidentiality protection that is not available with routine email, landline telephone calls, or mobile telephone calls. Skype audiovisual and instant messaging communications are automatically provided with substantial security benefits, including encryption. How Do Skype Seminars Operate?

Effective seminars via Skype operate interactively. They require only the presentation facilities normally applied for training or meeting events. (If desired, a seminar can be simultaneously delivered in multiple locations or a "Webinar" approach can be used to collect questions.)

A few simple preparations can enhance presentation effectiveness and encourage interaction:

- Configure the seminar room optimally for the number of seminar participants
- Make two screens clearly visible to participants, to simultaneously display the presenter and the presentation.
- Ensure camera quality and location give a clear picture of the room, with all participants visible. A camera with ability to zoom in on individual participants can enhance interaction.
- Ensure microphones and audio speakers provide good two-way sound. A portable microphone facility for participants can enhance interaction.
- Test the technical facilities before the seminar, especially if translation facilities are required or the room has not been previously used with the Internet
